They only are interested to know if their dream job is funny, cool or exciting. In fact, when we asked kids what they thought the most important part of a job was the majority said "having fun" or "helping others."

Here's a sampling of our respondents' ideal careers now:

1. Firefighter; 2. Teacher; 3. Cop; 4. Business owner; 5; CEO; 6. Artist; 7. Accountant; 8. Nurse; 9. Game developer; 10. Chef.

So most of these responses make sense. Doctors, teachers and nurses are prevalent in the life and often help children. A kid with a dog probably goes to a veterinarian. And of course, kids who grow up watching TV know all about athletes, singers and cowboys.

Today, the most common career our survey respondents want is to be retired. Retiring early is a dream of many, but only a few can have that.
